

Uniform Policy

Updated: June 2022 Replaces Uniform Policy May 2015

1. Policy Statement

Beverly Hills Girls High School aims to provide a safe, caring and welcoming learning place where all students and staff are treated with respect. Staff, students and parents share responsibility to ensure active support of the school Uniform Policy.

2. Benefits of School Uniforms

(as outlined in School Uniforms in NSW Government Schools 2004)

It has been found that the wearing of school uniform brings with it many benefits such as:

- developing students' sense of belonging to the school community
- providing an opportunity to build school spirit
- builds self-confidence and a sense of connection with the community
- enhancing the health and safety of students when involved in school activities
- promoting a sense of inclusiveness, non-discrimination and equal opportunity
- reinforcing the perception of the school as an ordered and safe environment
- increasing the personal safety of students and staff by allowing easier recognition of visitors and potential intruders in the school
- making school clothing more affordable for families by eliminating the risk of peer pressure to wear transiently fashionable and expensive clothes
- defining an identity for the school within the local community
- promoting positive community perceptions of public education

3. Our Beliefs

The wearing of school uniforms by students will assist the Beverly Hills Girls School Community in:

- encouraging unity and equality between students
- preparing students for dress and safety codes required by employers
- promoting the school's image within the community
- enhancing school spirit
- · increasing student confidence
- cost-saving for parents

4. Uniform Requirements

Teachers, students, parents and caregivers work together to encourage students to wear full school uniform.

SPORTS UNIFORM

The items listed below are only worn on sports PE specific days and events:

Green /yellow polo with school logo

Sport shorts green with school logo

School Zip jacket and tracksuit pants

Appropriate sports shoes with white socks

All head wear including scarfs, are to be white

Important information:

- Shoes- Black, flat, leather or vinyl enclosed school shoes. No canvas shoes or coloured soles/laces. If participating in Science lessons or TAS practical subjects, leather/vinyl shoes *must* be worn.
- Gloves do not form part of the uniform, if worn, they are to be free of logo, slogan or pattern.
- Neck scarves are to be bottle green.
- Beanies are **NOT** part of the school uniform and are not acceptable.
- Jewellery –Earrings should be sleepers or small studs.
- Necklaces need to be compliant under WHS legislation.
- Acrylic nails are **not** part of the school uniform and are **not acceptable** under H & S legislation

All regulation uniform items can be purchased from the uniform shop

5. <u>Uniform Policy/ Responsibilities</u>

This uniform policy will be actively supported by the School and its' Parent community by recognising respective responsibilities.

School Responsibilities

- Beverly Hills Girls High School will make uniform available through *Daylight* uniform suppliers located on the school grounds.
- Negotiate and liaise with the P and C in matters relating to the management of the Uniform Policy.
- Families who are experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to contact the school.
- When available, second hand uniforms can be purchased from the school office.
- Review the dress code requirements at lease every five years and develop strategies for he wearing of school uniform.
- Ensure the school's uniform adheres to health and safety and anti-discrimination requirements.
- Provides information to parents and carers about the school's uniform requirements.

Parent Responsibilities

- Support the school Uniform Policy by providing their daughters with all items of uniform.
- Write a letter of explanation if student is not in uniform.
- Read and sign a copy of the policy.
- Support the school in relation to the policy.

Student Responsibilities

- Support and comply with the School Uniform Policy by wearing the uniform every day.
- Obtain a letter of explanation from their parents if they are out of uniform.
- Present the letter of explanation to their relevant, or available, Deputy Principal and obtain an out of uniform pass on arrival at school.
- Irrespective of letter of explanation, students MUST report to their relevant, or available, Deputy Principal for an Out of Uniform Pass.

6. School Uniform Management

Repeated and unexplained failure to wear full school uniform may result in a lunchtime detention, after school detention or a parent interview in accordance with the Quality Learning Levels and, Behaviour Policy and Procedure Student Behaviour (nsw.gov.au)

Procedure

All students are required to see their relevant, or available, Deputy Principal to receive an out of uniform pass (yellow) with a note from their parent explaining why the student is out of uniform at the beginning of the school day. If students choose not to obtain an out of uniform pass, they will be placed on detention at lunch.
